Dear Reader,

Welcome to the 2023 syllabus for the Ramsbottom Music Festival. After the turmoil of the last few years we are looking forward to running our full event in March 2023 in the way we have done so for many decades. We look forward to returning to the activity levels of previous years – naturally that is something that requires your direct help. Without a healthy number of entrants participating in the Festival, it is harder to maintain a financially viable organisation. Currently we are in good shape, but each year we strive to maintain a financial cushion which will allow us to continue our event in the future.

We are particularly grateful to those individuals and organisations, both locally and further afield, who support us directly with their donations. As a not for profit entity, every penny that we raise goes towards putting on our event and we would also like to register our thanks to the team of volunteers who work behind the scenes throughout the year as well as those you will see on the Festival day itself.

We have now fully embedded our online system for entry processing, which has helped tremendously with the work behind the scenes on planning and co-ordination of the performances. Once again we have a great team of adjudicators who will be listening to, and commenting upon, the performances – offering positive critiques and suggestions on how to improve.

One change that we have decided upon is to remove our Schools day event, which usually takes place on the Friday. Many schools have found the re-establishment of choir and ensemble activities challenging, and with the added burden of increasing travel costs, we felt that the marginal benefit of that element of the event was something that we needed to take into account. We may well, however, run a 'virtual' competition as this was something that some of our previous entrants have asked us to consider. We'll keep you posted via the website and our social media feeds.

All that remains for me now is to wish you good luck with your entry – do please send us as many of your pupils as you can if you're reading this as a music teacher – equally do share this syllabus or signpost your friends and colleagues to us as well and, as always, we look forward to putting on a busy, vibrant and friendly Ramsbottom Music Festival in 2023.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- a. All entries must be made online, which must be submitted on our entry website not later than Sunday 22nd January 2023.
- b. Entries must include fees to be considered as complete fees cannot be refunded unless due to exceptional circumstances.
- c. The Committee reserves the right to refuse entry.
- d. Pieces may not be changed once the entry has been received.
- e. Every entrant must submit, by the closing date, a printed copy of the piece(s) to be performed for the Adjudicator's use at the time of the festival. The copy must be submitted in good time to the Assistant Secretary (address details are provided on the online entry system). If a copy is not provided, the Adjudicator will be unable to award any marks.
- f. <u>If you require an official accompanist at the time of the festival, you must provide an original copy for them to use for the performance</u>
- g. Use of photocopied or hand-copied music by the performer is illegal and will not be accepted for use. However, an agreement with the Music Publishers' Association allows a photocopy for Adjudicator's use only, which will be destroyed after the festival by the festival stewards. Bona fide downloaded music copies are permitted.
- h. The official accompanist will charge a fee of £10 for a rehearsal of up to 20 mins for grades 1-5 with the entrant, and for grades 6 & above the fee is £15 for a 30 minute session. The fee is payable directly to the accompanist at the time of the rehearsal.
- i. **Age requirement.** In all classes where an age limit is stipulated, each entrant must be within the limit on 1st March 2023.
- j. **Grade requirement.** In all classes where a grade is stipulated, it refers to the Associated Board grade or equivalent (for Electronic Keyboard classes, Trinity College grade or equivalent; for Electric Guitar Classes, RGT@LCM grade or equivalent). The entrant doesn't need to have passed the examination. The music can be chosen from the examination list or can be any other piece(s) of the equivalent grade.
- k. **Grade of pieces played.** It is the responsibility of the entrant/teacher/parent to ensure that the piece(s) chosen are at the correct grade for the class entered. A place cannot be awarded if in breach of this rule, or rule (j). In the interest of fairness, it is expected that entrants will be entered at their current grade.

FESTIVAL RULES

Please read the following rules carefully — especially those who have not been to the festival before. To help the smooth running of the festival, all entrants should make themselves known to a steward when they arrive on the day to perform.

- 1. Late arrivals. If an entrant arrives after the adjudicator has decided the placings for the class (whether or not the adjudicator has started speaking) then the entrant may perform and receive a written critique but the placings for the class will not be changed. If an entrant arrives before the adjudicator has decided the placings for the class then the entrant may be allowed to participate fully in the class.
- **2. Final decision.** The decision of the Adjudicator is final and speaking to the Adjudicator is not allowed. The decision of the Committee in all questions or disputes arising out of, or not provided for, in these rules and the above conditions shall be final.
- **3. Alteration of Adjudicator or class.** The Committee reserves the right to engage additional adjudicators and to transfer classes from one session / day to another.
- **4. Personnel.** In the event of the unavoidable absence of a member of a duet, trio or group, substitute(s) will be allowed. The organisers must be advised in advance of the class being held.
- **5. Amateur status.** All classes shall be open to amateurs only. For this purpose 'amateur' is defined as follows: Any person whose principal means of livelihood is obtained from non-musical work, even if he or she from time to time accepts a fee, stipend or honorarium for musical or dramatic services rendered.
- **6. Instruments.** Any entrant competing on different instruments in the same class must play different pieces on each instrument.
- **7. Warm up in Piano classes.** A warm up will consist **only** of the playing of, literally, one or two scales or chords.
- **8. Trophies.** Winners of trophies will be required to provide us with contact details and to bear the cost of any engraving. Trophies must be returned to the Trophy Secretary in good condition one month prior to the next Festival.
- **9. Marking system.** Awards may be withheld if, in the opinion of the Adjudicator, sufficient merit is not shown. Otherwise first, second and third place certificates will be awarded in all classes.
- **10. Choral classes.** Competitors in Choral Classes must have been bona fide members of the group for at least two months prior to the Festival.
 - No Conductor will be allowed to sing with his or her choir.
- **11. School instrumental groups.** School instrumental groups may be conducted by their teacher and the group may be accompanied but only on the piano.
- **12. Performance time.** Entrants whose performance time exceeds the time limit for the class will not be placed.
- **13. Photography.** In line with BIFF recommendations, <u>no unauthorised photography or video recording is allowed at our Festival</u>. Where parents / guardians / carers do not wish photos to be taken at all, the responsible adult attending should ensure that their child / pupil / vulnerable adult is not included in official authorised photos, as well as indicating this choice on the entry system.
- **14. Electronic equipment.** The use of electronic equipment for sound amplification of a performance is not allowed (except in Electronic Keyboard / Electric Guitar classes for Electric Guitar time will be allocated beforehand for a quick soundcheck/run through with the backing track. Performers must bring all of their own equipment).

The above are our official accompanists, although please note we may amend the accompanists if it becomes necessary. Entrants may bring their own accompanist if they wish.

Our accompanists spend time in preparation and rehearsal, and we ask you to read condition (h) on the Conditions of Entry page, which concerns their fee for this.

To defray the accompanists' expenses on the day of the festival, there is an additional fee of £2 for each class in which an entrant requests an official accompanist; this fee is payable at the time of submitting an entry.

If you request the services of an official accompanist with your entry, he or she will contact you before the festival to discuss a rehearsal. It is important therefore that you provide correct contact phone number and email addresses with your entry so that the accompanist can contact you personally to arrange rehearsal. The contact number / email address should be that of an adult and must **not** be those of the child.

Please remember also to submit a hard copy of the accompanist part along with your copy of the performance piece(s) which the adjudicator will use to mark your entry performance. Please clearly indicate on the copies the performer and class in order for us to process your entry efficiently.

KEY INFORMATION FOR ENTERING THE FESTIVAL

- All entries, including those from schools, must be entered onto the online entry system by Sunday 22nd January 2023. Entries after that date may not be considered.
- Please give performance time rounded up to nearest quarter minute. Ensure that your actual performance time is within the class limit in order to avoid disqualification.
